

The Katie Bentley Lilac Project

s a 1989 graduate of the Business Management program, John Bentley has long ties to NHTI. This past spring, John's connection to the College became even stronger: NHTI participated in the Katie Bentley Lilac Project.

Three years ago, John and his wife, Cheryl, suffered a terrible loss. Their fouryear old daughter, Catherine Ann, died from complications of pneumonia after a brave three-week struggle at Children's Hospital in Boston. How do parents face a tragedy of this magnitude?

For John and Cheryl, the answer came on Memorial Day in 2009.

John explains, "We were planting some flowers on her grave, and we noticed the conspicuous absence of any flowers blooming in the cemetery. I wondered what kind of flowers could be planted that would look good year after year, that would require little maintenance, and would be in bloom around Memorial Day. Since purple was Katie's favorite color, the obvious choice to me was lilacs. On that day, I was inspired to plant hundreds of lilacs at that cemetery, as a living memorial to my daughter. The Katie Bentley Lilac Project was born."
